

Faridabad Satellite Hospital

The Faridabad Satellite Hospital was inaugurated by Dr. R.K. Seth in November 1993. The person who was pivotal in making this happen was an old friend and well wisher of Venu, Late Mr. M.L. Chatrath. In the year 1991, working as Administrator (Rural Development), Escorts, he took the challenge of fighting blindness in district Faridabad.

Mr. Chatrath met Dr. Seth and discovered that they had a common passion and commitment : erradiction of blindness.



A satellite hospital was established in Maharaja Agrasain Hospital, situated about one and a half hour's road journey, south of Delhi, in the rural area which stretches beyond and behind the industrial belt of Faridabad.

In 1997, Venu's Satellite Hospital shifted into the premises of Sant Bahgat Singhji Maharaj Gurudwara where the Gurudwara already housed a multi specialty dispensary. The change in location was primarily to give better accessibility to the patients so that many more people could reach eye services.

In September, 2003 an Eye Donation Centre was started with the objective of spreading awareness and to facilitate retrieval of eyes in district Faridabad.
